**The Communion** - *All baptized Christians are welcome to receive Communion. To receive, come forward to the Altar rail. Those unable to may remain in their seats or come to the step at the end of the line and the elements will be brought to them. Communicants may receive the blessed host in the hand, held out right on top of left, or upon the tongue. The chalice follows. To drink, use the base of the chalice to guide it to the lips. To intinct, leave the host in the hand.*

*The Minister will dip the host and return it. Self-intinction is not permitted. Reception in one kind is sufficient to fully participate in the Sacrament. Arms crossed indicates reception of a blessing instead of Communion.*
