

The Bishop, when present, or the Priest, stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, **A** forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

**People** And also with you.



The people standing. The Celebrant, whether bishop or priest, faces them and sings or says





Then, facing the Holy Table, the Celebrant proceeds

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

For with your co-eternal Son and Holy Spirit, you are one God, one Lord, in Trinity of Persons and in Unity of Being; and we celebrate the one and equal glory of you, O Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:





The people stand or kneel. Then the Celebrant continues

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.  $\triangle$ 

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or to lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.








#### The Breaking of the Bread

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.

#### Fraction Anthem: Christ our Passover, (Hymnal S 163)





Facing the people, the Celebrant says the following Invitation

#### The Gifts of God for the People of God.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive Communion. Those receiving come forward to the Altar rail. Those unable to come to the rail may remain in their seats or wait and come to the step at the end of the line and the elements will be brought to them. Communicants may receive the blessed host in the hand, held out right on top of left, or upon the tongue. A Eucharistic Minister administers the chalice. To drink, hold the base of the chalice to guide it to the lips. For intinction, leave the host in the hand, and the Minister will dip the host and return it to the communicant. Self-intinction is not permitted. Reception in one kind is sufficient to fully participate in the Sacrament. Arms placed across the chest indicates a reception of a blessing instead of Communion.
